Hello Everyone,

Currently, there are two competitions available; the first being for a Riverboat Center in New Orleans, Louisiana. First prize is \$5,000 with substantial prizes awarded for second and third prizes. The deadline for submissions is February 17 so you better hurry. If eleven days is not enough time for you and some friends to design a Riverboat Center then you might want to consider the second competition available which is a Cultural Arts Center in Beijing, China. First prize is a trip to China with \$1,000 spending money. There are also substantial awards for second and third prizes. Anyone can enter these competitions, (most of the time groups can enter), so if you're interested, more information is located on the A.I.A.S. bulletin board on the second floor of the new building.

There is a program that some students have shown an interest in which is called 'Habitat for Humanity'. The program is involved with building homes for eligible families (often homeless or low-income) at a very low cost. The program employs people for ten weeks which are spent building the homes for these people. Habitat for Humanity offers hands on experience for this summer and interested in making up to \$4,000 dollars in just ten weeks contact me or Mike Service at 676-0946. This kind of experience would look great on your resume as well as being vital to a future architect. This type of employment offers you the chance to get away from home for a while but also offers you some free time to enjoy the summer.




